#### Wisdom

It seems like this summer we've been focused on Wisdom here at Spruce Run. On one hand, I've been doing final edits to our project we'd started the previous summer: Wisdomfrom Spruce Run. On the other hand, every three years a bunch of readings from the Old Testament wisdom books of Proverbs, Job, and Ecclesiastes, as well as the only wisdom book of the New Testament, James, come up as first or second readings for two or so months in a row.

At its core, "Wisdom Literature" is focused on practical knowledge, how to survive and thrive in a moral way throughout life. Often times this is done by describing a wrong and foolish way of living in the world, followed by the wise, right, way of living in the world.

Our Wisdom from Spruce Run project was a unique Bible Study. In it I gave a brief description of the concerns of each of the 3 main Wisdom book of the Old Testament, and the questions they

focused on, but then the rest of the time was spent on collecting the groups thoughts and answers to those Wisdom questions. I want you to know that your fellow parishioners gave deep and meaningful answers to these questions, and showed how they are truly still relevant today. You should look forward to the release of this Wisdom from Spruce Run book on Reformation Sunday.

This book will be released that day because Reformation Sunday is also the day our confirmands will be confirming their faith. We'll be passing this book on to them as a way to pass on some of our hard-won wisdom.

We'll be giving them a model for being a faithful person at a variety of ages. We're giving our confirmands space to imagine what being an adult Christian will be like as they get older—When I reach decision points in the road about my career or family life, how might I make decisions that are faithful? When I'm middle aged, what will my Baptized life look like? When I retire, what will be a wise way to fill my time? When old age comes knocking, how do I greet it as a Christian? What do I have to look forward to throughout my life? How do I navigate it well?

Finally, a word on the Letter of James. As I've said before, Luther was uncomfortable with James because the letter has a different focus than most of the other letters in the New Testament, and on top



of that the Counter-Reformation used the book as a "proof text" against Lutherans. That said, it is a good book, it's just doing something a little different than Pauline letters Luther loved. It is asking the question: How should Christians live wisely in the world after the death and resurrection of Jesus? James' answer is: point to God's grace with your own generosity, speak in ways that are gentle, live a faithful life by showing forth blessings and mercy, and pray always.

I have several hopes for this season of Wisdom that we have been in as a congregation. I hope that: it is helping you live out your faith in concrete ways, challenges you to imagine what it is like to be a Christian at different times of life, encourages you to be thankful and prayerful, and helps you to navigate a world that can be challenging in many ways.
